They engaged in all sessions and hopefully can now start using the strategies to continue to succeed in school.

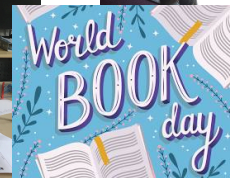
We took advantage of the lovely spring sunshine and ended the hub program with a fun trip out Magnet fishing on the canal.

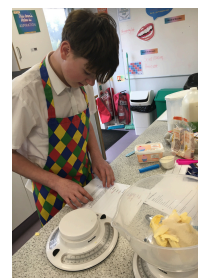
### WORLD BOOK DAY
